Where am I? June 7th – October 4th, 2020

What is visible and what is perceived? Where am I? In order to feel a sense of orientation, people often require a fixed point of navigation. Places can also be charged with meaning: they can seem familiar or strange, they can be narrow or wide, and they can point outwards or open inwards. Through the use of text as an aesthetic element and a pictorial medium, the artists document their everyday experiences and establish a relationship between person, place, and the present. The artists showcase their understanding of space through the melding of words and images. The exhibition brings together artists from Kunsthaus Kannen and California for the first time.

23rd Annual Exhibition and Sale 2020 October 11th - January 31st, 2021

The annual sales exhibition, which has taken place every year since 1996, presents over 300 pictures and objects by artists who work in the realm of Outsider Art, art and psychiatry, selftaught art, and contemporary art. Artworks made within the past year by residential artists in our studio and by international artists are showcased in our large exhibition space and up for sale. In order to encourage and support talented, emerging artists from around the world, Kunsthaus Kannen has an open call for submissions for them to display their work and reach a broader public.

Wavelength February 16th – March 29th, 2020

The exhibition opens a creative dialogue between the students and studio artists through a wide variety of media: painting, drawing, sculpture, photography and film. 16 students from the University of Fine Arts Münster create artworks engaged with themes concerning the social context of psychiatry. Is there a wavelength connecting art and psychiatry? Are there any criteria in which both are experienced, and if so, where do they come from and who defines them? What kind of interactions and inferences arise? Do they share a correlational or cause-effect relationship? The exhibition invites you to answer these questions.

"In the ocean of my soul..." April 5th - June 1st, 2020

The space within our inner eye is immeasurable. "In the ocean of my soul everything is full of pictures of great things ... and that's where I meet myself," said theologian Augustine about 1700 years ago. The Kunsthaus presents works by artists who make their inner world of personal encounters and sensations visible to the outside world through painting, drawing and sculpture. In doing so, notions of creativity, sexuality, self-awareness and extrinsic experiences are called upon to reflect and test our imagination. The exhibition contemplates the similarities between sensory and sexual organs, of openings and wounds, of seeing and hurting, and how these subjects recur throughout art history and present day.

Museum for Outsider Art and Contemporary Art

Kunsthaus Kannen is situated between Lüdinghausen and Münster in the middle of the green parkland of Münsterland, in close proximity to the Dortmund-Ems canal with excellent connections to its extensive bicycle routes. An integral part of the Alexianer Münster GmbH, a clinic for psychiatry and psychotherapy since 1996, Kunsthaus Kannen was originally created in order to support the needs of long-term patients with exceptional artistic talent. Their creativity and development has been supported since the early 1980s. The created works were so convincing that the errection of a museum with ateliers made sense.

In the course of years, Kunsthaus Kannen not only expanded but also gained a national and international reputation as a well-known place to meet and exchange views. Numerous national and international exhibitions and cooperations between outsider artists and professional artists have resulted in Kunsthaus Kannen evolving into a meeting place for Contemporary Art and Art Brut.

A spacious new building covering an area of 620m² which is suitable for people with special needs has been providing space for art studios and an exhibition hall under the same roof since 2000 with lots of space for projects, workshops, conferences and lectures dealing with the subjects "art and psychiatry", "art brut" and "outsider art". Today, Kunsthaus Kannen is strongly integrated in the city's cultural offer.



Studios

The Kunsthaus Kannen studios for drawing and painting provide room for 15 people in an area of 150sqm, and these spaces are an integral part of the hospital's different projects. For those who are looking for sculptural expression there is also a work-room available. Under the care of experienced art therapists, both psychiatric and mentally disabled people have the opportunity to develop their talents and to learn different techniques of artistic expression.

Furthermore there are various workshops which provide the opportunity to meet artists from other studios, both Germany and beyond, as well as to exchange and expand their experiences gained during years of active creativity. A studio community has arisen, in which everybody is able to develop his or her own style. In a supporting climate full of esteem and acceptance pictures, sculptures, drawings, figures and actions are created.

Collection

Using the wealth of material collected of more than 35 years of art therapy, Kunsthaus Kannen has organized numerous exhibitions both around Germany and abroad. The collection now consists of more than 5000 works of art including drawings, paintings and several sculptural objects.



As an integrative meeting place, the Kunsthaus welcomes all of the interested visitors to its studios and exhibitions, small specialized library and museum shop.
